Anatoly Chubais, the curator of the Rosnano corporation's displays, presented the VIP guests with a photo printed on a piece of glass with the help of groundbreaking printer technology. The Russian-designed device, which can print on glass as well as other surfaces, has generated a lot of interest even in such technologically advanced countries as South Korea and Japan, Chubais said.

The dignitaries then proceeded to the area devoted to the 2014 Winter Olympics in the Russian Black Sea resort of Sochi. Here, they saw 3D models of ski slopes prepared for the Winter Olympics.
