Led by Sochi 2014 President and CEO Dmitry Chernyshenko, Sochi 2014 is taking the opportunity to join a full range of sessions organised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and International Paralympic Committee (IPC) which will help inform the staging and delivery of Sochi 2014.

The event is organised to provide Sochi 2014 and future Games organisers with the opportunity to learn from the experience and knowledge gained by their London counterparts during their seven years of preparation.
