The ramp for the competition will be erected on an artificially pre-built slope that can accommodate around 30,000 spectators. Standing at a staggering 60m in height and spanning for 150 meters, the ramp is reportedly 25% larger than the previously built ramp that was used for the Freestyle and Snowboard World Cup events.
