

The Olympics Council approved to have the rail and highway links for the Sochi 2014 Winter Olympics reduced, which is said to ease the impact on the environment. 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While the light-rail system that links the venues would have one track instead of two, the highway that connects the sites will also be reduced from four lanes to three.

Likewise, the snow sports will be held near a nature conservation area within the delicate ecological mountaineous region.
